

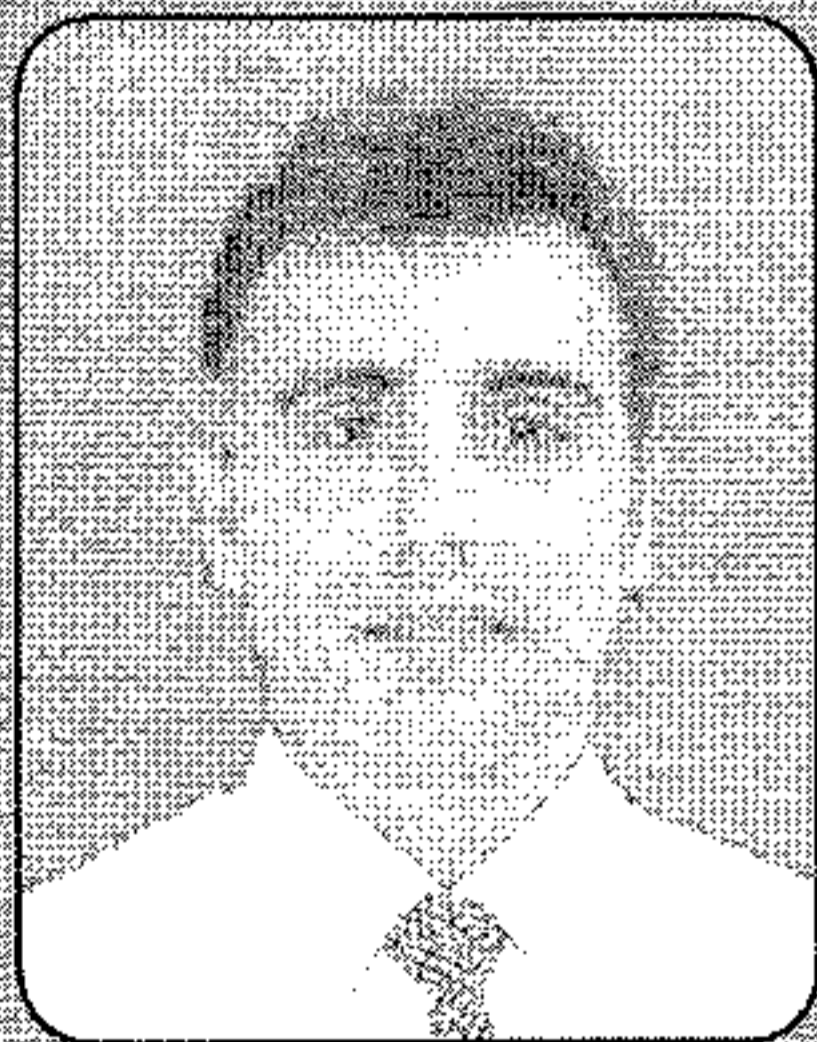
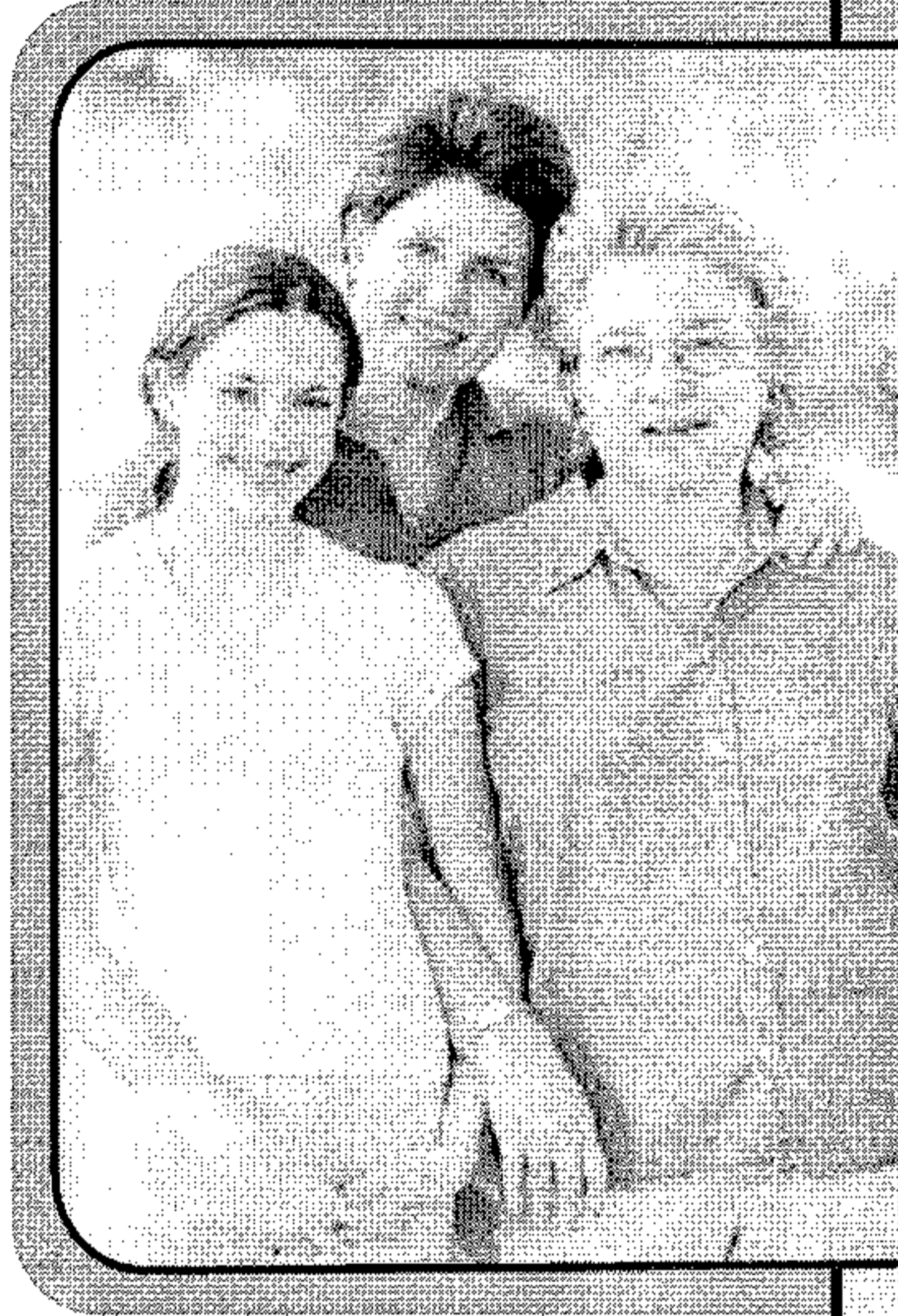

The Silent Threat

According to the American Cancer Society, ovarian cancer is sometimes called the 'silent killer' because symptoms usually don't appear until the later stages. Unfortunately, about 75% of cases are not diagnosed until the cancer has spread, which greatly reduces chances of survival. Those most at risk include: women over 50; a family history of the disease; women who never had children; and those with a personal history of breast or colon cancer.
